## <u>General</u>

- If the new and old charter provisions conflict, the new provision prevails
- Provides protection to historic district residents from past abuse
- More city council oversight

## <u>Specific</u>

- HDC membership limited to five people
- 35 days' notice of vacancies to allow interested people ample opportunity to apply
- Further defines HDC member qualifications
- Procedures must be approved by city council and posted online
- HDC meetings must be recorded and uploaded to the city's website
- Requires complete compliance with the Open Meetings Act examples include:
  - Requiring notice and an opportunity to attend site inspections by three HDC members and prohibiting "round robin" visits to evade the requirement
  - Eliminating Memorandums of Administrative Approval (because they are issued in violation of the Open Meetings Act and not authorized by state statute)
  - Properly noticed special meetings required for exigent circumstances
  - Limited categories of emergency repairs can proceed within published guidelines approved by the city council
  - People may not be told not to attend HDC meetings
- Proper recordkeeping and retention
- No HDC authority over ordinary maintenance and repairs that don't change exterior appearance
- HDC concerns limited to interior and exterior changes that can be seen from the street (painting is still excluded)
- Limits the HDC's authority over open spaces to Depot Park
- Declares that plants, trees, landscaping, and fences are not historic resources for HDC regulation
- Limits enforcement actions
  - HDC must try to work things out with the homeowner first and mediate disagreements on the nature of remedial actions and the timeframe for completion
  - City council must approve all civil infractions and court actions concerning repair and restoration
  - No stop work orders
- City council must approve all professional fees and other expenditures
- Home deed alteration prohibited
- Citizen complaint procedure established
